WORKCOVER WA NOTICE

CHILD'S ALLOWANCE: PROOF OF PARTICIPATION IN FULLTIME STUDY

The Workers Compensation and Injury Management Act 2023 provides for a child's allowance to be paid to each eligible dependent child who is between the ages of 16 and 21 if the child is a full-time student, and for WorkCover WA to require evidence of participation in full-time study.

This notice sets out WorkCover WA's requirements for providing evidence of a dependent child's participation in full-time study.

Following a compensation order by an arbitrator to pay the child's allowance, WorkCover WA requires a statutory declaration be submitted to WorkCover WA every six months.

The declaration is required to attest that each dependent child is or will be a full-time student for the forthcoming six month period.

A statutory declaration in the form of Appendix 1 will be provided by WorkCover WA to the declarant ahead of each 6 month reporting period and must be returned:

- By **15 May** for the period the child is in full time study from 1 July to 31 December of that calendar year.
- By **15 November** for the period the child is in full time study from 1 January to 30 June of the next calendar year.

The statutory declaration must be sent to: FinanceTrust@workcover.wa.gov.au

A declarant in most cases is the legal guardian of the child. However, any child 18 years and over must complete a statutory declaration themselves.

If a declaration is made and a child subsequently ceases to be a full-time student, the declarant must notify WorkCover WA immediately via FinanceTrust@workcover.wa.gov.au

This notice is effective from 1 July 2024.
